CONSIDERATIONS TO REMEMBER WHEN HIRING A CARE PROVIDER

While the need to be at work is essential, there are still considerations when choosing childcare that should be remembered. Here are the top considerations to remember as recommended by the Early Childhood Alliance:

Adult to Child Ratio

- Infants: 1 to 4
- Toddlers (2 years): 1 to 5
- Preschool (3-4 years): 1 to 10

Learning Environment

- Activities are age-appropriate
- Children are being prepared for school
- Parent engagement is encouraged

Caregivers' Qualifications

- Credentials/experience working with children
- Current background checks by federal/state/local
- Staff receives annual training
- Program participates in Paths to QUALITYTM

Safe and Healthy Environment

- Staff with current CPR and first aid training is
 always present
- Environment is clean and safe
- Safe sleep environment provided to infants
